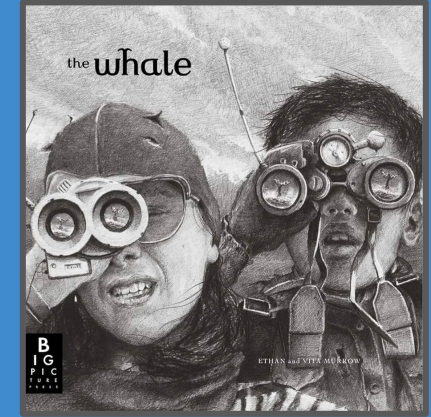
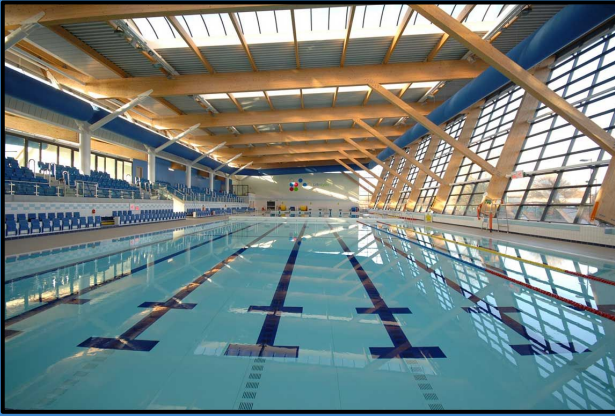

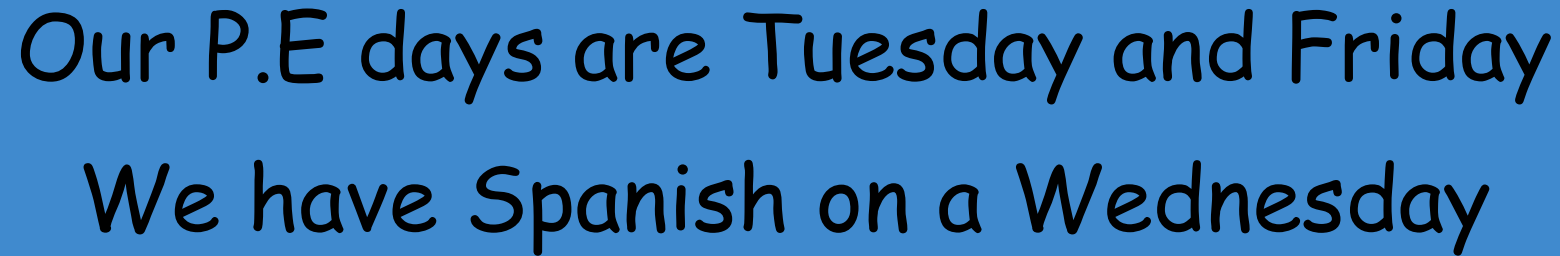
Our core subject areas will be focused on completing the primary school curriculum and preparing the children not only for the KS2 statutory assessments, but also for high school.

Important information

Multiplication Check

The multiplication tables check (MTC) is a statutory, on-screen assessment for all Year 4 pupils in England to determine their fluent recall of multiplication tables up to 12×12 . The 25-question check takes about 5 minutes, with 6 seconds per question, and helps schools identify pupils needing extra support. There is no pass mark; results are reported as a total score out of 25, with higher scores indicating greater proficiency.
